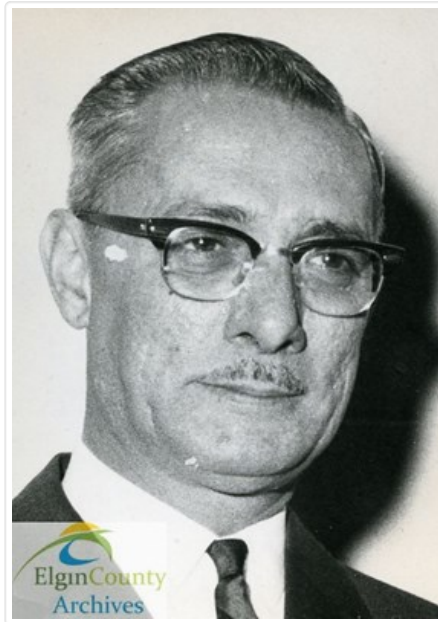

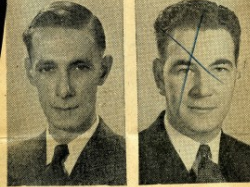

CAPT. CHARLES ELDERT Fellow officers this week honored Capt. Charles Eldert by electing him president of the Elgin Regiment Officers' Mess.

Capt. Eldert, whose promotion to major is expected to be announced soon, succeeds Capt. S. J. Abel and his term of office will run until September, 1958. Capt. Abel is remaining a member of the mess committee as immediate past president.

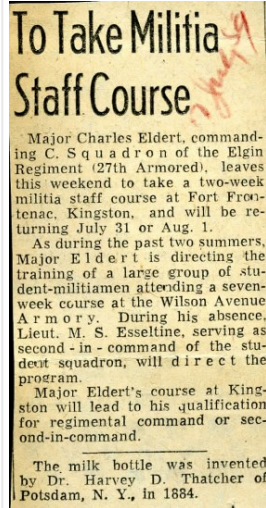

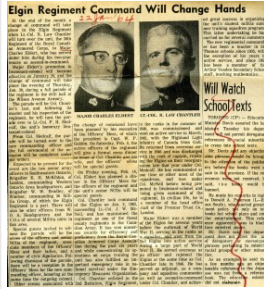
