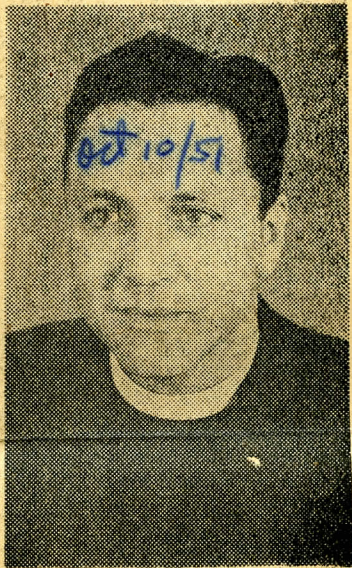


NEW RECTOR AT TRINITY CHURCH



REV. JOHN L. DUNCAN, M.A., L.Th., who was appointed rector of Trinity Anglican Church a few weeks ago, arrived in St. Thomas from Simcoe with Mrs. Duncan on Tuesday and they have taken up residence in the rectory at 81 Wellington street. Mr. Duncan will take his first services in Trinity Church on Sunday, Oct. 14, which will also be the Harvest Thanksgiving services.

Born in Windsor, a son of Angus M. Duncan and the late Mrs. Duncan, Mr. Duncan attended Huron College and the University of Western Ontario, graduating in Arts in 1934, receiving his Master of Arts degree in 1936, and the degree of L. Th. from Huron College in the latter year. He was a member of the football team while at Western. In 1936, he went to England, serving as assistant at St. Pancras Church in London for about two years before returning to Huron Diocese. While in England, he was married to Miss Eileen Armstrong, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Frederick Armstrong, of London.

Returning to Canada, Mr. Duncan was rector at Delhi for two years and at Leamington for a year before entering the chaplaincy service in January, 1942. For the next four years he served in the Army and was overseas in northwest Europe with the 12th Manitoba Dragoons. Following the war, he worked on the Anglican Advance Appeal in the Diocese prior to being appointed rector of Trinity Church, Blenheim, the first of a succession of three Trinity Church appointments, for in March 1949 he went to Trinity Church, Simcoe, from where he has just come to Trinity Church, St. Thomas.

The three children of Rev. and Mrs. Duncan did not accompany them on Tuesday, but will join them here shortly. They are Robert, who will be ten years old next week; Stephen, who will be nine in January; and Mary, who was three on Tuesday of this week.
